Security Updates

1. No One Home?: Are going out of town for business or pleasure? Is your house vacant due to a hospital visit or the house is on the market? If you would like our Patrol Officer to personally inspect around your property, please email contact@cityofwellingtonky.com with your full name, address and out of town phone number. Officer Fey will contact you directly if any issues arise in your absence.



2. **Car Break-Ins:** When the weather gets warm, there tends to be more car breakins. Please keep your cars locked and your valuables out of site.

3. Recent Home Checks by Officer Fey: Last month, Officer Fey visited residents to perform home inspections to bring your attention to potential security risks and ways to make your home more secure against break-ins. It was a huge success with those that participated. Officer Fey has agreed to do a second round of home inspections on Saturday June 9 between 9am-1pm. All City residents are encouraged to bring up to 165 lbs. (5 banker boxes) of documents to be securely destroyed on site. Please take advantage of this opportunity to shred all of your sensitive/confidential papers such as bank/credit card statements, canceled checks, credit card applications, old tax returns, basically, any piece of unwanted paper that contains anything you wouldn't feel comfortable having a stranger read.

The City was able to receive \$2,500 in Metro grant funds for this project.

Want to Wn \$300!!! Insurance Premium Tax Incentive! Plus Keep Taxes in Wellington. A Double Bonus!

Under state law, each of us pays an Insurance Premium Tax whenever we purchase or renew any of the following types of insurance policies:

- Homeowners (property and casualty)
- Automobile
- Fire and allied perils
- Life

- Business Insurance
- Inland marine

Because the CITY OF WELLINGTON is located within Jefferson County, on many occasions this Insurance Premium Tax is diverted to other tax jurisdictions in error. This tax is already calculated and included in the premiums you pay for nsurance coverage. Each year, your tax dollars pay for sanitation and recycling services, fire protection, police protection, street paving, sidewalk repairs, and much more. The tax on insurance companies is a key source of revenue to cover these ever rising expenses.

No insurance company will provide us a list of policyholders within the City of Wellington. Therefore, we need your assistance to make sure these funds are sent to the City of Wellington to be used to pay for our city services. We are requesting that you verify with your insurance company or companies that your Insurance Premium Taxes are being sent to the City of Wellington. You can do this by reviewing your insurance policy declarations page. If you find that the City of Wellington is not the recipient of the Insurance Premium Tax, please call your insurance agent to have this corrected. By doing this, you will help make sure the tax you are already paying will be used within your City!

All residents who provide proof that the City of Wellington is listed as the recipient of the Insurance Premium Tax for their insurance policies will be entered into a drawing for a \$300 Visa Gift Card. To be entered into this drawing, please scan and email a copy of the current declarations page(s) for your insurance policy or policies to Lois Roby at loisroby@icloud.com by **August 1**st. All information will remain confidential, and feel free to redact any information with the exception of your name, address, insurance provider, and the section confirming that Wellington is receiving the Insurance Premium Tax.

Please Clean Up Your Dog Droppings

It is your dog's poop and therefore your responsibility. Please keep our city clean and neighbors happy. Not only does this make you a good neighbor, but there is a Louisville City Ordinance that requires all owners who walk or exercise their dogs to

carry a "suitable device" for cleaning up their dog's feces.

Violation of this ordinance can result in fines.

Other neighborhoods have seen this leading to an increase of rodents. Large cities are starting to fine pet owners who don't pick up their pet's mess. Put plainly, rats and other rodents are attracted to dog poop because they like to eat it. In fact, dog poop is said to be the number one food source for rats in developed areas. If your community has a rat



problem you may want to investigate whether that problem is being fueled by a pet waste problem.

Please clear all outside drains and culverts of grass, weeds, leaves and other debris. Even If you don't live there, we ask you to help out. Several of our drains are set low in the ground and are often overlooked.

The Dandelion Dilemma

Want to rid your lawn of those pesky dandelions? There are a number of chemical weed killers on the market, but there are some natural treatments as well. You can:

- <u>Dig Them Out</u> Dig them up by the roots. Pulling off the tops won't help; you
 have to pluck out the roots.
- Apply Corn Gluten Meal CGM might be the ultimate organic weed and feed.
 It's is a great pre-emergent, but can still be used a few times during growing season. The nitrogen in the meal will keep your lawn green and healthy.
- <u>Pickle Them</u> Just pour some household vinegar on them. This trick also works with foxtail, velvetleaf, smooth pigweed and thistle.
- Mow More Often When dandelions are blooming, mow them often to prevent the blossoms from maturing into seeds.
- <u>Eat Them!</u> Dandelion greens are more nutritious than spinach, with impressive levels of Vitamins A and C and lots of iron, calcium, phosphorus, potassium, magnesium and copper. And the juice of the root plant is still used by herbalists for diabetes treatment, as a mild laxative, and to help build up the blood. YUM!

An Invitation to Farmington's Neighbors: Come Celebrate Farmington's 2016 Bicentennial and View the Calendar of Events

Farmington Historic Plantation is one of Kentucky's premiere historic sites. The renowned Speed family established the site as a working hemp plantation in the early 1800s, completing construction of the main house in 1816, exactly 200 years ago. Members of the Speed family played prominent roles in local,



state and national politics. One of the Speed sons, Joshua, was Abraham Lincoln's best friend. Another son, James Speed, served as Attorney General in Lincoln's cabinet. Of particular historical significance was the visit Lincoln made to Farmington in 1841 as he deliberated what course of action he should take in his courtship of Mary Todd. Historians say it was during his return travel to Illinois following that visit that Lincoln solidified his antipathy to slavery due to seeing slaves chained together on a riverboat.

Farmington has created a full schedule of events to celebrate its Bicentennial year. (See schedule below. Note, some events require the advanced purchase of tickets.) As part of its Bicentennial Celebration, Farmington is also offering a special invitation to its closest neighboring cities, including the residents of the Wellington. All residents of nearby small cities will get a 50 % discount for tours of Farmington during the Bicentennial summer months running from June 1 through August 31. The tour includes viewing the outstanding Lincoln Exhibit in our Visitors Center and a docent guided tour of the main house which has been faithfully restored to its 1841 appearance. If you have never been to Farmington, or if you have not been to Farmington recently, we invite you to drop by for an educational tour. A map for self-guided tours is also available at our Visitors Center, so feel free to drop by and just take a relaxing walk of the grounds if that is your preference.

Finally, Farmington is always in need of volunteers. Many of their best volunteers are residents of nearby neighborhoods who enjoy helping out at Farmington as a way to support their own local community.
