Snow Removal

With winter approaching, as usual, Wellington has contracted to have snow removal handled on our streets once the accumulation has reached a certain limit. Know we have our residents safety in mind and will plow as appropriate.

Safety Tips

Days are getting shorter quickly so several reminders for safety and to deter crime:

- Be aware of your surroundings at all times (people and vehicles);
- Always have a well charged cell phone;
- Always lock your vehicle, even if going into the house for "just a minute";
- Do not leave keys or car fob in the vehicle;
- Park in the garage if possible, or inside a backyard driveway with a locked gate; and
- Install security lights/cameras/doorbells.

Security Rebate

In line with the security suggestions above, the City is once again offering a rebate program to residents for security light(s) and/or cameras to continue keeping our neighborhood safe. Reimbursement is up to \$100 for a camera and \$50 for a security light. Citywide Patrol Services

Our patrol services in Wellington include Chief Michael Lamey, Officer Dennis Clark and his people-friendly K-9, Dash, all from Strathmoor Village Police.

- For any emergencies, please dial 911 as usual.
- If you want to get in contact with Strathmoor Village Police directly, dial 502-574-5471 and request a Strathmoor officer.
- For non-emergency issues, dial Strathmoor Village Police's nonemergency line at 502-432-8900.
- As part of our contract, they will be offering house watches, welfare checks, bike safety courses, and assist at city events.
- You may want to add these numbers into your contacts.

BEFORE YOU DIG

Remember that you or your contractor should call 811 before digging on your property. They will be able to locate electric or water lines to your pool, lines to septic tanks, electric lines to sheds or landscape lighting, lawn sprinkler systems, invisible pet fencing and more.

City of Wellington Facebook

The City of Wellington Facebook page was created for neighbors in Wellington to keep each other informed of community events, block watch news and general information. It does not serve as a public forum. It is a closed group available to to current residents only. if you have a concern regarding a city ordinance, please contact a City commissioner. All requests to join must include the resident's physical street address for verification.

Projects, PODs and Permits

No PODs or dumpsters may be placed on your property without first obtaining a permit from the <u>Commissioner Crocker</u>. All permits are subject to approval by the City Council and must be submitted in writing. Please download the correct permit from <u>cityofwellingtonky.com</u> and mail/email the permit in 10 days prior to the dumpster/pods arrival.

The Little Libraries on the big island are always looking for

donations. Please restrict the books placed in the little library to those for the younger children.

Trash Containers and Recycle Bins

Trash containers and recycle bins are to be placed at the curb <u>no earlier than</u> <u>Monday</u>, the day before Waste Management System's pick-up day. Residents are expected to remove and properly store trash containers from the curb no later than Tuesday evening.

Large Waste | Junk Pickup

Wellington does not have designated "junk pickup" days. They will pick it up on the same day as regular service, however, you must call Waste Management in advance to make them aware so they have resources. 502-966-0117

Yard Waste

Yard waste must be in yard containers or paper bags which are purchased specifically for yard waste. Limbs or branches should be tied in manageable bundles no longer than four (4) feet long and placed at the curb the night before your scheduled Waste Management System pick-up day. Unbundled items will not be picked up.

Homestead Exemption

Property owners who are 65 or older are eligible to receive the Homestead Exemption on their primary residence. If you are eligible, the exemption amount is subtracted from your property's assessed value, reducing your property tax liability. Only one exemption is allowed per household. The Homestead Exemption applies to your Jefferson County and Wellington tax liability. For information, contact the Jefferson County PVA Homestead Department at 574-6380.

Keep Taxes in Wellington

Just a reminder for all new neighbors:

Every homeowner pays an Insurance Premium Tax (IPT) whenever purchasing or renewing any of the following insurance policies:

- Homeowners (property and casualty)
- Automobile
- Fire and allied perils

- Life
- Business Insurance
- Inland marine

The City of Wellington tax dollars from these policies pay for our sanitation and recycling services, fire protection, police protection, street paving, sidewalk repairs and much more. Because the City of Wellington is located within Jefferson County, often these funds are diverted to other tax jurisdictions in error.

<u>Please check your insurance policy declarations page to confirm the</u> <u>Insurance Premium Tax they are paying is directed to "City of Wellington</u> <u>40205" and not "Louisville Metro" or "Wellington KY 40387" as the</u> <u>recipient of the tax. Monies going to either of those jurisdictions do not</u> <u>benefit our City. The Insurance Premium Tax fee is a source of revenue</u> <u>for Wellington and assures the money you are paying will be used within</u> <u>the City, which makes it possible for our City ad valorem property taxes</u> <u>to remain low!</u>
